

Pangea Shawl

Step 1

Fiber: ~950 yards fingering weight yarn. Samples are knit in Curious Creek Wasonga (blue) and Simply Shetland silk/wool blend (green).

Needles: U.S. 6 circulars (you may begin with any length, but will need at least 36" to finish).

You will also need 4 stitch markers and a yarn needle.

Because this is a shawl, not a fitted garment, and because its size can be adjusted by blocking, gauge is not crucial on this project. Feel free to move up or down a needle size to get the lace effect you want.

To Begin:

Cast on 5 stitches.

Row 1: Knit across

Row 2: Knit into front and back of every stitch

Row 3: Knit across

Row 4: K1, [YO, K1] across = 19 stitches

Row 5: Knit across

Work from Chart A, placing markers as indicated. Chart shows edge stitches, right pattern area, and center stitch. For left half of shawl, repeat right lace pattern, then work two edge stitches.

Note that this chart shows only odd-numbered rows. For all even-numbered rows K2, P across, and end with K2. (Be sure to work a row 40 before moving on.)
