


Pangea Shawl

Step 2

Now that you've worked the first 40 rows, work the sixteen rows of Chart B. The chart shows the beginning and end of one half of the shawl, the center stitch, and one full pattern repeat. Work the pattern repeat as many times as necessary for each side of the shawl. As before, work the right half of the shawl and the center stitch, then repeat the right lace stitches for the left half, and end with the K2 edge. All even numbered rows are worked as K2, P until 2 stitches remain, K2. Don't forget to work a row 16.

At this point, you should have 131 stitches on your needles arranged as follows: 2 stitches, marker, 63 stitches, marker, 1 stitch, marker, 63 stitches, marker, 2 stitches.

Chart B



You will now work two transition rows before beginning the next lace stitch.

Transition row 1: K2, sl marker, YO, K4, YO, K1, YO, [K5, YO, K1, YO] until 4 stitches remain before center marker, K4, YO, sl marker, K1 (center), sl marker, YO, K4, YO, K1, YO, [K5, YO, K1, YO] until 4 stitches remain before edge marker, K4, YO, sl marker, K2.

You should now have 175 stitches on your needles arranged as follows: 2 stitches, marker, 85 stitches, marker, 1 stitch (center), marker, 85 stitches, marker, 2 stitches.

Transition row 2: K2, P171, K2.

Now you can work the first 14 rows of the next lace stitch following Chart C. Note that all decreases on this chart are worked as purl stitches. The chart shows the beginning and end of one half of the shawl, the center stitch, and one full pattern repeat. Work the pattern repeat as many times as necessary for each side of the shawl. As before, work the right half of the shawl and the center stitch, then repeat the right lace stitches for the left half, and end with the K2 edge. All even numbered rows are worked as K2, P until 2 stitches remain, K2. Don't forget to work a row 14.
